

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2093
OFFERED BY MR. KAGEN OF WISCONSIN

At the end of the bill, add the following (with the correct sequential provision designations [replacing the numbers currently shown for such designations]):

1 SEC. 14. IMPACT OF EXCESS NUTRIENTS ON COASTAL
2 RECREATION WATERS.

3 (a) STUDY.—The Administrator shall conduct a
4 study to review the available scientific information per-
5 taining to the impacts of excess nutrients on coastal recre-
6 ation waters.

7 (b) REPORT.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year
9 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Adminis-
10 trator shall transmit to the Committee on Transpor-
11 tation and Infrastructure of the House of Represent-
12 atives and the Committee on Environment and Pub-
13 lic Works of the Senate a report on the results of
14 the study conducted under subsection (a).

15 (2) IMPACTS.—Such report shall include infor-
16 mation on any adverse impacts of excess nutrients
17 on coastal recreation waters, including adverse im-

1 pacts caused by algal blooms resulting from excess
2 nutrient.

3 (3) RECOMMENDATIONS.—Such report shall in-
4 clude recommendations for action to address adverse
5 impacts of excess nutrients and algal blooms on
6 coastal recreation waters, including the establish-
7 ment and implementation of numeric water quality
8 criteria for nutrients.

9 (4) CONSULTATION.—In developing such re-
10 port, the Administrator shall consult with the heads
11 of other appropriate Federal agencies (including the
12 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration),
13 States, and local government entities.
