18	"(b) RESTRICTION ON RECOVERY FOR NON-		
19	RESIDENT ALIENS EMPLOYED ON FOREIGN PASSENGER		
20	Vessels.—A claim for damages or expenses relating to		
21	personal injury, illness, or death of a seaman who is a		
22	citizen of a foreign nation, arising during or from the en-		
23	gagement of the seaman by or for a passenger vessel duly		
24	registered under the laws of a foreign nation, may not be		
25	brought under the laws of the United States if—		

1	"(1) such seaman was not a permanent resident
2	alien of the United States at the time the claim
3	arose;
4	"(2) the injury, illness, or death arose outside
5	the territorial waters of the United States; and
6	"(3) the seaman or the seaman's personal rep-
7	resentative has or had a right to seek compensation
8	for the injury, illness, or death in, or under the laws
9	of—
10	"(A) the nation in which the vessel was
11	registered at the time the claim arose; or
12	"(B) the nation in which the seaman main-
13	tained citizenship or residency at the time the
14	claim arose.".
