I am writing to convey the strong support of the International Union of Painters and Allied Trades (IUPAT) for passage of the conference report of the *Water Resources Reform & Development Act of 2014 (WRRDA).*

On a daily basis and in every corner of the nation, our skilled crafts men and women work to prevent rust and corrosion on locks, dams, ports, and waterways. We applaud Chairman Bill Shuster, Chairwoman Barbara Boxer, Ranking Members David Vitter and Nick Rahall as well as the respective Subcommittee Chairmen and Ranking Members Bob Gibbs, Tom Carper, Tim Bishop, and John Barrasso for recognizing that this type of work is absolutely vital for keeping water infrastructure, in which so much of our economy depends, operating continuously and safely.

We further support their effort to create jobs for the construction industry overall.
