

SLIDE 1: NUMBER OF U.S. PRESIDENTIAL DISASTER DECLARATIONS – 1953-2011



## SLIDE 2: COST OF MAJOR DISASTER DECLARATIONS BY SIZE FY 1989-FY 2014




SLIDE 3: Role of Federal Government in Disaster Loss Payment (proportion of total economic loss)


