## A BILL

To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act with respect to general permits under the national pollutant discharge elimination system, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Clarifying Federal
- 5 General Permits Act".

## SEC. 2. FEDERAL GENERAL PERMITS.

- 2 Section 402(a) of the Federal Water Pollution Con-
- 3 trol Act (33 U.S.C. 1342(a)) is amended by adding at the
- 4 end the following:
- 5 "(6)(A) The Administrator may issue general permits
- 6 under this section on a State, regional, or nationwide
- 7 basis, or for a delineated area, for discharges associated
- 8 with any category of activities, which discharges are of
- 9 similar types and from similar sources.
- 10 "(B) If a general permit issued under this section will
- 11 expire and the Administrator decides not to issue a new
- 12 general permit for discharges similar to those covered by
- 13 the expiring general permit, the Administrator shall pub-
- 14 lish in the Federal Register a notice of such decision at
- 15 least two years prior to the expiration of the general per-
- 16 mit.
- 17 "(C)(i) If a general permit issued under this section
- 18 expires and the Administrator has not published a notice
- 19 in accordance with subparagraph (B), the Administrator
- 20 shall, until the date described in clause (ii)—
- 21 "(I) continue to apply the terms, conditions,
- and requirements of the expired general permit to
- any discharge that was covered by the expired gen-
- eral permit; and
- 25 "(II) apply such terms, conditions, and require-
- ments to any discharge that would have been cov-

1	ered by the expired general permit (in accordance
2	with any relevant requirements for such coverage) if
3	the discharge had occurred before such expiration.
4	"(ii) The date described in this clause is the earlier
5	of—
6	"(I) the date on which the Administrator issues
7	a new general permit for discharges similar to those
8	covered by the expired general permit; or
9	"(II) the date that is 2 years after the date on
10	which the Administrator publishes in the Federal
11	Register a notice of a decision not to issue a new
12	general permit for discharges similar to those cov-
13	ered by the expired general permit.".
