On behalf of the Air Medical Operators Association (AMOA), I am writing to express our strong support for the "Aviation Funding Solvency Act" (H.R. 6086). AMOA commends the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee's leadership for introducing this needed legislation.

AMOA was founded in 2009 as an organization representing Part 135 certificate holders operating air medical fixed-wing aircraft and rotorcraft. The association is dedicated to advancing safety through sharing best practices, establishing safety commitments, and meeting and exceeding federal regulatory requirements. AMOA member companies operate more than 1,200 aircraft and employ thousands of aviation and health care professionals dedicated to lifesaving medical transport missions.

AMOA and its members rely on the uninterrupted and effective performance of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to ensure the safe and efficient regulation of the national airspace system. In light of past experiences with government funding lapses that have disrupted FAA operations and impacted AMOA member companies, we appreciate that H.R. 6086 would ensure continuity of critical FAA safety and oversight activities by authorizing temporary funding during lapses in appropriations.

In addition, emerging entrants into the airspace, including UAS, present significant and complex challenges to safe air medical operations. A fully-staffed and fully-operational FAA is essential to help address these growing challenges.

AMOA looks forward to the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee's favorable action on H.R. 6086 and its enactment into law.
