

**AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE  
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2741  
OFFERED BY MRS. GONZÁLEZ-COLÓN OF PUERTO  
RICO**

Page 20, after line 25, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 211. MARITIME DOMAIN AWARENESS IN COAST GUARD**  
2 **SECTOR FOR PUERTO RICO AND VIRGIN IS-**  
3 **LANDS.**

4 Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment  
5 of this Act, the Commandant shall submit to the Com-  
6 mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House  
7 of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce,  
8 Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report con-  
9 taining—

10 (1) an overview of the maritime domain aware-  
11 ness in the area of responsibility of the Coast Guard  
12 sector responsible for Puerto Rico and the United  
13 States Virgin Islands, including—

14 (A) the average volume of known maritime  
15 traffic that transited the area during fiscal  
16 years 2020 through 2023;

1 (B) current sensor platforms deployed by  
2 such sector to monitor illicit activity occurring  
3 at sea in such area;

4 (C) the number of illicit activity incidents  
5 at sea in such area that the sector responded to  
6 during fiscal years 2020 through 2023;

7 (D) an estimate of the volume of traffic  
8 engaged in illicit activity at sea in such area  
9 and the type and description of any vessels used  
10 to carry out illicit activities that such sector re-  
11 sponded to during fiscal years 2020 through  
12 2023; and

13 (E) the maritime domain awareness re-  
14 quirements to effectively meet the mission of  
15 such sector;

16 (2) a description of current actions taken by the  
17 Coast Guard to partner with Federal, regional,  
18 State, and local entities to meet the maritime do-  
19 main awareness needs of such area;

20 (3) a description of any gaps in maritime do-  
21 main awareness within the area of responsibility of  
22 such sector resulting from an inability to meet the  
23 enduring maritime domain awareness requirements  
24 of the sector or adequately respond to maritime dis-  
25 order, including illicit drug and migrant activity;

1           (4) an identification of current technology and  
2 assets the Coast Guard has to mitigate the gaps  
3 identified in paragraph (3);

4           (5) an identification of capabilities needed to  
5 mitigate such gaps, including any capabilities the  
6 Coast Guard currently possesses that can be de-  
7 ployed to the sector;

8           (6) an identification of technology and assets  
9 the Coast Guard does not currently possess and are  
10 needed to acquire in order to address such gaps; and

11           (7) an identification of any financial obstacles  
12 that prevent the Coast Guard from deploying exist-  
13 ing commercially available sensor technology to ad-  
14 dress such gaps.
