

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2997****OFFERED BY MR. LIPINSKI OF ILLINOIS**

At the end of subtitle B of title IV of the bill, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 4 \_\_\_\_ . WAIVER PROCESS UNDER PART 107.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
3 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the  
4 Federal Aviation Administration shall streamline the proc-  
5 ess for requesting certificates of waiver pursuant to sec-  
6 tions 107.200 and 107.205 of title 14, Code of Federal  
7 Regulations, and expedite the process by which the Fed-  
8 eral Aviation Administration reviews and grants such re-  
9 quests.

10 (b) STREAMLINING ACTIONS.—In order to streamline  
11 and expedite the part 107 waiver process as required by  
12 subsection (a), the Administrator shall, at a minimum,  
13 take the following actions:

14 (1) Publish and post on a publicly accessible  
15 website detailed and specific guidance about the in-  
16 formation, data, and documentation necessary to  
17 support a successful waiver request for each regula-  
18 tion for which waivers may be granted under such  
19 part. The guidance shall provide—

1 (A) significantly more detail and specificity  
2 than is provided in the small unmanned aircraft  
3 system, waiver and airspace authorization appli-  
4 cation instructions; and

5 (B) examples of safety justifications that  
6 have satisfied the respective performance-based  
7 standards in previously successful waiver re-  
8 quests.

9 (2) Establish a password-protected, private,  
10 web-based, online account system by which small un-  
11 manned aircraft system operators with pending part  
12 107 waiver requests can monitor the status of their  
13 requests.

14 (3) Provide an electronic mail response from  
15 the Federal Aviation Administration that acknowl-  
16 edges receipt of a part 107 waiver request and a  
17 waiver application reference number and identifies at  
18 least 1 person, including such person's or persons'  
19 specific electronic mail address, to whom status in-  
20 quiries about the waiver request may be directed  
21 after the waiver request has been pending for 2  
22 weeks. The person so identified shall respond to any  
23 such status inquiry not later than 3 business days  
24 after such inquiry, providing a status update, noting  
25 any issues with the waiver request identified as of

1 the response date, and an estimated date by which  
2 the Federal Aviation Administration will issue its de-  
3 termination on the waiver request.

4 (4) Approve or deny a part 107 waiver request  
5 not later than 60 business days after the date of  
6 submission of the waiver request and shall imple-  
7 ment a process for expedited appeals of any waiver  
8 request that is denied.

9 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section the terms “un-  
10 manned aircraft”, “unmanned aircraft system”, and  
11 “small unmanned aircraft” have the meanings given such  
12 terms in section 45501 of title 49, United States Code,  
13 as added by this Act.
